## **ITMC Commission Rules**

- Title of Rule:** Rule on Information Exchange System Reporting Requirements
- Reason for Rule:** To further define terms pursuant to Article 8 and Article 9 of the Interstate Teacher Mobility Compact.
- Chapter:** Rulemaking on Information Exchange Requirements
- Authority:** Article 7: Establishment of the Interstate Teacher Mobility Compact Commission  
Article 9: Facilitating Information Exchange  
Article 8: Rulemaking
- 1.0 Purpose:** Pursuant to Article 9.A and Article 8, the Commission shall promulgate reasonable and lawful uniform rules to facilitate and coordinate implementation and administration of the Interstate Teacher Mobility Compact. This rule will become effective upon passage by the Commission as provided in Article 8 of the Compact.

**Approved March 17, 2026, Emergency Rule-Writing Meeting**  
**Vote:** 11 in favor; 0 opposed; 2 being absent (Florida & Oklahoma)

## 1.1 Uniform Data Set and Levels of Access:

- A. The Commission shall provide for the development, maintenance, and utilization of an information exchange system containing licensure, adverse action, and investigative information on all individuals seeking to use this Compact.
- B. Notwithstanding any other provision of state law to the contrary, a member state shall submit a uniform data set to the information exchange system on all licenses found to be eligible under this Compact as required by the rules of the Commission, including but not limited to:
  1. Identifying information – including but not limited to:
    - a. license title
    - b. unencumbered status of license
    - c. population, subject area, grade and age bands covered by license
  2. Initial licensure requirements information – including but not limited to:
    - a. degree requirements
  3. Public member state information
    - a. URL to member state’s public teacher licensure lookup tool or expedited license verification process
    - b. URL to teacher licensure application for individuals seeking to use this Compact
    - c. Sample license certificate with key fields and explanations if available
- C. A member state shall, on request by the receiving state, share the following applicant information.
  1. Identifying information – including but not limited to:
    - a. first name
    - b. middle name or middle initial if available
    - c. last name
    - d. suffix, if applicable
    - e. birth date (mm/dd/yyyy)
  2. Licensure data – including but not limited to:
    - a. eligible license held
    - b. jurisdiction of licensure
    - c. license number
    - d. license status
  3. Adverse action(s) against a license or compact privilege to practice including but not limited to:
    - a. type of adverse action
    - b. whether the license was encumbered
    - c. status and change in status of adverse action
    - d. effective dates of adverse action
    - e. the existence of current significant investigative information
    - f. summary suspension and final disciplinary actions, as defined by the

- member state authority
  - g. non-confidential information related to a disciplinary diversion program participation including but not limited to current participation by the teachers in a disciplinary diversion program
  - h. any denial of application for licensure, and the reason(s) for denial
  - i. other information that may facilitate the administration of this Compact, as determined by the rules of the Commission including but not limited to:
    - i. corrections to a licensee's data
- D. The receiving state shall be responsible for verification of license eligibility and closest equivalent license as described in Article 3 of the Compact.
- E. A member state shall update the uniform data set described in 1.1 (B) within 30 days of any change.
- F. A member state shall report any adverse action taken on a individual's license to the National Associate of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC) Clearinghouse within 30 days of the effective date of adverse action.
- G. A member state shall, upon licensure application, request the following information from individuals seeking licensure under this Compact:
1. Any licenses issued by a member state
  2. Military status
  3. Military spouse status
- H. A member state may report the impact of the Compact by tracking how many applicants were licensed under the Compact at the annual business meeting of the Commission.
